SILENT WITNESS PROGRAM

Therefore, we have created a silent witness line so that you can report any criminal activities that occur on campus. This can be done anonymously by calling or emailing us.

Nature of the incident

- > Person(s) involved
- > Injuries, if any
- > Weapons used, if any
- > Any other information that might assist in the investigation or arrest

EMERGENCY CALL BOXES

Emergency call boxes are located throughout the campus. These boxes provide direct communication with the SSU DPS dispatch office. Once a box is activated, its blue light will allow responding officers to locate you quickly. All emergency call boxes are marked with the word **EMERGENCY** in red lettering. Only activate a call box when you:

- > Feel threatened
- > Witness an incident
- > Need to report a crime
- > Feel intimidated
