

What Can Affect Your Aid!

Your financial aid award is an estimate of your eligibility. There are many factors which could change, lower, or even eliminate your financial aid eligibility (including loans). Here are some examples:

- Not attending or dropping classes
- Failing to attend each term or sub-term for which you were registered
- Withdrawing from the University
- Failing to properly withdraw from the University
- Failing to maintain [Satisfactory Academic Progress](#)
- Providing incomplete or inaccurate information during the application process
- Receiving additional sources of aid (such as outside grants, veterans benefits, or private loans)
- Receiving aid above the amount of the cost of attendance
- Changing enrollment level (some scholarships require at least full-time enrollment; Federal Direct loans require ½ time enrollment). Defaulting on student loans.
- Providing false or misleading information
- Changing residency status
