### Roaring SSU Initiative: Regular Substantive Interaction (RSI)

n 2020, the U.S. Department of Education made public updated regulatory definitions of distance education that higher education institutions receiving Title IV funds must comply with in the Distance Education and Innovation Ruling.

The U.S. Department of Education requires that all online courses for which students may use Title IV funds (federal financial aid) "ensure that there is regular and substantive interaction between students and instructors."



The CPE has brought an online short course developed by the USG to SSU. It is the hope that all faculty, who teach online, will take this RSI Certification course in order to be SACSCOC compliant. Presentations began at the end of 2023 and implementation has now begun in 2024. To date, we have had seventy-two (72) members of the faculty and staff take the course and pass the final exam. Congratulations to the first 72 certified. We look forward to continued participation in this valuable learning.
