What We are Doing

Roaring SSU Engagement: EDUCAUSE AI Landscape Study

Moving from reaction to action, Savannah State University (SSU) is currently exploring the opportunities afforded by AI for HBCUs in teaching, learning, and job market skills while maintaining a sense of caution for the vast array of risks AI-powered technologies pose. To aid in these efforts, EDUCAUSE presented their inaugural [EDUCAUSE AI Landscape Study](#), in which they summarize the higher education community's current sentiments and experiences related to

policies and procedures, workforce, and the future of AI in higher education. This survey was distributed from November 27 to December 8, 2023, and focuses on the impacts AI has had on higher education since the mainstreaming of generative AI tools.¹

Despite the growing focus on AI, there is still a lack of formalized training at institutions: only 56 percent of universities train their faculty members in AI, with the numbers dipping for staff (49 percent) and students (39 percent).

There's also a lack of long-term focus and goals, according to the report, which found only seven (7) percent of institutions are working to establish AI-focused senior leadership positions and just 14 percent are budgeting for long-term AI costs.²

SSU is answering the call for knowledge and skills training collaborating with Tennessee State University (TSU). A cohort of staff and faculty are preparing for the AI for ALL Conference 2024 hosted by TSU this summer.

Take a Closer Look: Jora McDonald

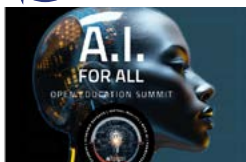
