New National Science Foundation (NSF) Grant: "iApply: Early Interdisciplinary Applied Strategies to Strengthen STEM Education and Research at SSU"

The project's innovative curriculum reforms and interdisciplinary applied research are aligned with the project goals and measurable objectives of active and immersive learning, and we expect these transformations to be successful based upon initial preliminary data, and advanced VR 3D visualization facilities developed through the FSCI program funded by Title III. Successful implementation will add to the knowledge base on how to support and engage UR students in advanced applied STEM research to maintain interest in STEM careers and to increase the diversity of the STEM research workforce. This project will increase STEM student retention and improve our graduation rate. This project will serve as a model for other institutions serving a diverse UR population.





Activity Budget

- All Activity Directors should be keeping track of their funds spent throughout the year. At least 80% of activity funds should be spent at the end of July
- All activity spending is being monitored by the Title III Office. If your activity is flagged as "not spending" funds may be swept from your activity and given to another activity to spend.

Requests/Approvals

- Staff and/or Student Employment Contracts must be submitted for approval at least two weeks prior to their official start date. Please note, submission time should take into account the gathering of signatures from:
 - ⇒ Business and Financial Affairs office (all contracts)
 - ⇒ Financial Aid office (student contracts only)
 - ⇒ Human Resources office (all contracts)
 - A background check has to be completed for all new staff contracts before they can begin working.
- Business and Financial Affairs Office has re-opened the PeopleSoft system for you to enter requisitions.

*During this time of teleworking, some adjustments are being made for request being submitted due to COVID-19.

⇒E-Procurement/Manual Procurement - Please submit all payment requests for Registration, Membership, Supplies, etc. via the electronic/manual procurement form.

Title III Office

- Phase I Data has been submitted to the Department of Education. This data determines Title III's funding level for the upcoming budget period (October 2020 - September 2021).
- Quarterly Reports and Equipment Inventory Reports (April 2020-June 2020) were due to the Title III office on July 10th, 2020.
- All Title III related reports should be submitted on time. Failure to comply will result in funds being held until all reports have been received.

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
